



Fly Green Fund wins Biofuel Partnership of the Year Award

Amsterdam, World Biofuel Markets, March 15, 2016 – During the award ceremonies at the World Biofuel Markets conference, the Fly Green Fund was announced as the winner of the Biofuel Partnership of the Year Award.

The Fly Green Fund was launched in June 2015. Founders are SkyNRG, the Nordic Initiative for Sustainable Aviation (NISA) and Karlstad Airport, and launching partners are Swedavia, SAS, Braathens, KLM and EFS European Flight Service. The Fund is the first of its kind in the world and enables organisations and individuals in the Nordics to reduce their carbon footprint, by flying on sustainable jet fuel. Its main focus is to secure the necessary funding to increase the demand for sustainable jet fuel in the Nordics.
